With munchies----meal to commence @ 4:00PM.


<u>Where:</u> Holden Rancherita---2549 E. Copper, Clovis. (See Map below or call 323-6753 for directions)

Icom IC-T81A Review

When I decided to get into VHF radio I bought a used 2-meter hand-held (Icom ICO2AT) from N6GPA. When that radio was borrowed, by persons unknown, without permission, I knew I would never see it again.

About a year later I decided it was time to get another HT. After searching the catalogs for some time I decided on the



Icom IC-T81A for several reasons. I like the physical size, bands covered, output power and the many features included.

This remarkable radio is slightly larger than a pack of king-size cigarettes (the instruction manual is larger than the radio), it covers four ham bands plus, in wide band mode, the FM broadcast band, AM aircraft frequencies, and can be set to receive 6-meter AM transmissions, but will not transmit in AM mode.

In the 50, 144 and 430 MHz bands the radio has extended receive frequencies but will transmit only in the ham bands. In the 1.2 GHz band the Tx and Rx frequencies are the same. There are several battery pack options supplying different voltages which will give an output power from 0.8 to 4.5 watts. With an external power supply of 12 volts the radio will deliver a full 5 watts. Maximum power on 1.2 GHz is 1 watt with the 12 volt supply and less than 1 watt with the various battery packs.

I found the digital readout function display easy to read and the back light can be set to OFF, ON, or AUTO, which lights when a key is pressed and then times out to conserve power. There are four scan functions available on each band. In the repeater range the radio will automatically set the repeater offsets or they can be set manually. 50 sub-audible tones are available for repeater use and there are nine DTMF memory channels available for up to 16 digits each.

I do not have access to all the features of this tiny radio since I do not have the software connecting cable but the radio is fully programmable from a PC.

I have only two complaints. With the wall charger the battery must be attached to the radio in order to charge it. With my old Icom the battery could be pelaced and then depleted one charged while the radio was being used wit the replacement battery. If an external power supply is used the battery must be removed. This brings me to my second complaint. I have not found a phony battery pack or cover plate to protect the back of the radio when an external power supply is used.

I have been using the IC-T81A radio in the shack with a homemade dipole antenna and have been very pleased with the results.

Exams for all Amateur license classes will be conducted on the following dates in Fresno, California. All exams are given on Sunday and Begin at 1:00 P.M.

August 19 November 18

Theory Exams are multiple choice. Code Exam is fill in the blank.

Location: Seventh Day Adventist Central Church, 2980 East Yale, Fresno CA 93703. One block south of Clinton and one block west of First Street, southwest corner of Yale and Orchard. Watch for signs.

Directions: From Hwy 99, take Clinton Ave. exit east four miles to First St., turn right (South), one block right on Yale, one block. Look for Signs. From Highway 41, take Shields Ave exit, turn right (East), 1 mile to First St., turn right, continue one block past Clinton, right on Yale to Orchard. Look for Signs.

Bring: Two ID's, one with photo. Taxpayer ID Number (Social Security Number) or ULS registration number. Fee is \$10.00 per test session. Original copy of Amateur License and CSCE's if upgrading.

Talk in on W6TO/R 146.94/64 repeater.

Walk-in's only, no pre-registration.
