

Amateur Radio VE Exams in Fresno Unlicensed thru Extra Class Fresno Amateur Radio Club – A.R.R.L. VEC

Exams for all Amateur license classes will be conducted on the following dates in Fresno, California. Exams are given on Sunday and Begin at 100 P.M.

November 3

Theory Exams are multiple choice. Code Exam is fill in the blank.

Location: Seventh Day Adventist Central Church, 2980 East Yale, Fresno CA 93703. One block south of Clinton and one block west of First Street, southwest corner of Yale and Orchard. Watch for signs.

Directions: From Hwy 99, take Clinton Ave. exit east four miles to First St., turn right (South), one block right on Yale, one block. Look for Signs. From Highway 41, take Shields Ave exit, turn right (East), 1 mile to First St., turn right, continue one block past Clinton, right on Yale to Orchard. Look for Signs.

Bring: Two ID's, one with photo. Taxpayer ID Number (Social Security Nu mber) or ULS registration number. Fee is \$10.00 per test session. Original copy of Amateur License and CSCE's if upgrading.

Talk in on W6TO/R 146.94/64 repeater.

Walk-in's only, no pre-registration.


August 4 VE Session Report

Amateur Exams were given in Fresno on Sunday August 4, 2002, with the following results: 12 candidates took 13 exam elements. There were 7 Techs, 1 Tech/wHF, and 4 Generals. The pass rate was 92%. One of the Generals was the result of an old Tech upgrade. Thanks to the VEs who helped make this session a success: W6RUJ, WB6QDN, KK6LT, KF6QJM, W6GV, KE6SHL, KO6JL, and WB6C.

The next Amateur Exam session in Fresno will be on Sunday November 3, 2002. Other Exam sessions are September 15 in Oakhurst and October 19 in Madera.

There are a number of "Old Techs" in the area who can qualify for a General Class license by coming to a VE session, paying the test fee, presenting a the current license, and a copy of a license, callbook page, or a print out from the QRZ 1993 database showing an effective date of the Technician license before March 21, 1987.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING—AUGUST 1, 2002

The meeting was called to order by president Harold Reeks, KF6CL, at 7:12 PM at Cedar Lanes in Fresno'.

Members Present: KF6CL, WA6OIB, KF6ZSW, W7POR, W6DPD, and WS6X.

Members Absent: WA6HII, W6JWK, W6YEP, K6MI, and KA6J.

Minutes and Treasury

The minutes of the June 6, 2002, board meeting were approved as distributed to the board.

The Treasurer reported the membership at 221. The total income between January and July, 2002, was \$5430.99 and expense was \$4181.11 for a net income of \$1249.80. The method to depreciate the club property will be investigated.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Field Day. Jim Clymer, WS6X, reported that the club made approximately 3900+ points. the paperwork was sent to ARRL in a timely manner. There was lots of participation by the members. The Pine Ridge School will be sought for Field Day, 2003.

Picnic. Ken Holden, WA6OIB, reported that 46 members and guests attended the picnic. The cost to the club was about \$100.

Christmas Party. The dinner will be at the Santa Fe Basque restaurant on Maroa at Shields on Saturday, December 14, 2002. Eating will start at 7:00 PM. The entree will be fried chicken. The cost will be \$18 per person. The deadline to send in reservations (and money) is December 6, 2002.

Jim Clymer, WS6X moved, Gene Davis, W7POR, seconded, the budget for the Christmas party be \$500. Motion carried.

Jim Clymer, WS6X, will make award certificates.

Nets. The conduct of the club nets on the repeater was discussed. Some changes in the process on the Brown Sugar Net need to be made to ensure compliance with the station identification requirements on Part 97 of the FCC Rules.

NEW BUSINESS

Election: President Reeks, KF6CL, announced that Ted Miller, K6FGE, and Lee Rhoy, AC6WS, will serve as the nominating committee for the upcoming election. The committee report is due at the September club meeting. The holdover members of the board are W7POR, W6YEP, K6MI, W6DPD and WA6OIB. Six board members are to be elected. Charles McConnell, W6DPD, suggested listing the term expiration for each director be placed on the second page of SKIP.

Hamfest. President Reeks, KF6CL, talked about a joint effort among the clubs in Kings, Tulare, Fresno, and Madera counties to sponsor a valley hamfest. He will make the contacts to see if this might be possible. A suggestion was made to have a San Joaquin Valley Section Convention . The hamfest needs to make a profit.

Classes. The club needs to have ham radio classes to teach Amateur Radio, not just the question pool for a particular license exam. This would include code instruction and practice.

Repeater. It was noted that the use of the repeater is down.

Surplus gear for the taking

Over most of my lifetime, I have bought "war surplus" gear when the price was right. I planned to buy other items of a higher price and put together a full home brew station. Due to lack of money or time, I never did very much with it. I have now reached the point where I must either throw it on the junk pile or give it away. There are a lot of very high quality parts such as variable capacitors and coils which are hard to locate nowadays.

I also have some items to sell. There is a 2000 volt power supply that must have cost the Navy over \$3000. It is quite dusty, but probably still workable, using silicon diodes instead of the original mercury vapor rectifiers. I also have a 28 volt REGULATED power supply that is probably in good shape. I got each of these for \$50 and will sell them at the same price. I got hold of a high quality crystal (from NASA) and built a precision 5 megahertz frequency standard oscillator. Make me an offer on that.
