#### 63rd FARC Hamfest

The books have been closed on the 63<sup>rd</sup> Fresno Amateur Radio Club Hamfest following good reviews from those who attended.

For the first time ever the event was held on the California State University, Fresno campus in the Satellite Student Union. (Whitfield Hall) This year the gathering returned to a one day affair. There were more than 230 paid attendees 136 took part in the luncheon. It was highlighted by guest speaker Bob Heil. (K9EID)

Heil recounted his working career from professional organist to his first audio amplifier repair which was really the beginning of what has become Heil Sound, Limited of Fairview. Illinois. With several amusing anecdotes he related his experiences as "the audio guy" for a string of famous rock bands. His most recent industry kudos and design success is a new microphone which he debuted at this year's National Association of Broadcasters convention. He was told by old line microphone makers that it couldn't be done. He told the amateurs attending the luncheon he "always replaced can't be done with why not and let me try." He capped off his address with a surprise gift of a top of the line Heil professional microphone.

The pre-luncheon activities included an amateur TV transmission from an airborne Pat Fennacy (W6YEP) with the on board camera manned by Ron Hunt (N6MTS). The video quality was excellent and provided a pilot's view of the CSUF campus as well as the foothill area east of Clovis. The video signal reception remained high quality through the landing of Fennacy's aircraft.

Fennacy by the way treated the luncheon attendees

All the chairs were filled for the technical forums on Satellite Communications with Dave Smith (W6TE) and Automatic Position Reporting System with Ted Freitas (KE6YJC).

The final presentation of the gathering was by Mike Stahl (K6MYC) of M-Squared Antenna fame. He recounted the tribulations and highpoints of his most recent DXpeditions off the coast of Argentina and in Dominica

## THE DX CORNER By Charles McConnell W6DPD

#### The Fall DX Season

The best conditions for DX are in the spring and fall. This has to do with the number of hours of daylight and darkness and the angle of the sun with respect to the earth. This affects the ionosphere, which controls propagation. During daylight the ionosphere is pushed closer to the earth, which shortens the skip distance on lower frequency bands and allows some skip on 15 12, and 10 meters. During darkness, the ionosphere expands away from the earth, so the distance is farther from the earth so the lower frequencies have longer skip distances. The summer and winter months are less desirable times for DXing.

The fall contest season will soon be here, with various state QSO parties including California's the first weekend of October, the CQ Worldwide DX contests in October (SSB) and November (CW), ARRL Sweepstakes in November and the ARRL 160 meter and 10 meter contests in December.

In late fall, there is long path propagation to India (VU), Sri Lanka (4S7), Pakistan (AP), Bangladesh (S2) and the entities in that area in the afternoon and evening hours. You point you antenna south to go after the DX.

There is long path propagation to Europe in the mornings and evenings depending on the bands. You point your antenna over Australia for this path.

The best way to find the DX is to tune the bands and listen.

There is a nice article on getting started on Log Book of the World on page 50 of the September 2005 QST.

There are a number of DX operations planned for the second half of 2005. Wake Island (KH9) will be activated from September 19 to 30. Kure Island, KH7K, will be activated from September 22 or 24 to October 8. Glorioso is scheduled for October-November. VK9XG (Christmas Island) is scheduled for Oct. 24 to Oct. 15 and VK9CC (Cocos Keeling) is scheduled for November 7-21. Peter I Island will be activated in January- February

2006. This is the third operation from this rareone. The 2006 International DX Convention is April21-23, 2006 at the Holiday Inn at Visalia.Good Luck.

Exams for all Amateur license classes will be conducted on the following dates in the Fresno California area. All exams are given on Saturday and begin at 9:30 AM.

November 12.

LOCATION: Center for Advanced Research and Technology (CART), 2555 Clovis Ave, Clovis CA 93612. This is on the southeast corner of Clovis Ave and Santa Ana.

DIRECTIONS: From Highway 99 South of Fresno, take Clovis Ave. Go north to Santa Ana Ave and turn right to the campus. From Highway 41 or Highway 99 North of Fresno, take Shaw Ave. exit, turn right (East), go to Clovis Ave, turn right to Santa Ana Ave, turn left, then on to the campus. The exams will be on the north side of the campus.

Theory exams are multiple choice. Code Exam is fill in the blanks. Express mail is used to send paperwork to ARRL, which sends data to FCC via electronic mail, thus assuring the fastest possible service. New licenses typically arrive in about two weeks.

IDENTIFICATION: Bring two forms of ID. One must have a photo. Taxpayer ID Number (Social Security Number), ULS registration Number or FCC Registration Number. Fee \$14.00 per test session. Bring Exact change. Original and copy of Amateur License and CSCE's if upgrading. Talk in on 146.94 repeater. Walk ins only, no pre-registration.
