The April column will be about the annual trek to Dayton.

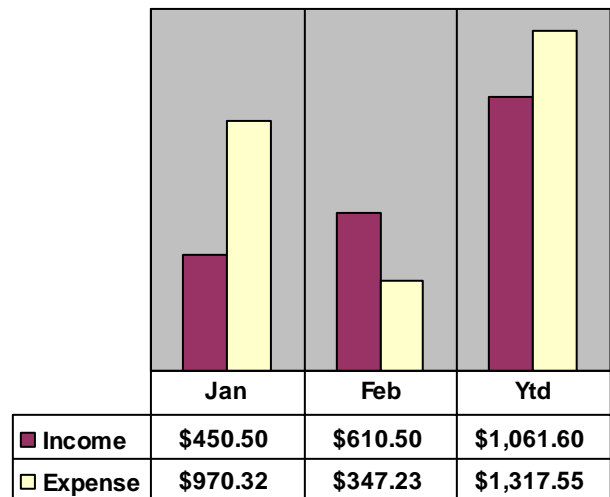

### ON THE AIR

Here we have the Fresno Technical High School Amateur Broadcasting Station, which is under the leadership of Mr. Martin. We are the first school in the state of California to resume broadcasting since the Pearl Harbor Days. The station is heard daily all along the Atlantic Coast from Maine to Florida, and frequently contacts are made with the Hawaiian Islands. The station operates with the fixed portable call "W6HYR" and is sponsored by the Electronics Club.

The student pictured in the middle is believed to be the late Bob Freund who owned and operated Acme Refrigeration in Fresno. Chuck McConnell (W6DPD) says Freund's call was K6EME. He passed away in the late 80's. The history of the other students is unknown.

The club call of W6HYR belonged to Erwin S. Martin. Ed Esheim (W6NCG) says Martin was greatly respected by the students. He relates that Martin had the distinction of being on 20 Meters talking to someone in Hawaii when the Japanese launched their attack about 7:00AM on December 7, 1941.

Fresno Tech started out as Fresno High School at Tuolumne and O streets. It became Fresno Technical School when the current Fresno High School opened its doors in the mid 1920's. It morphed into Fresno Junior College in the late 1940's. The building was demolished in 1950-'51. The site is now occupied by the Caesar Chavez education center.

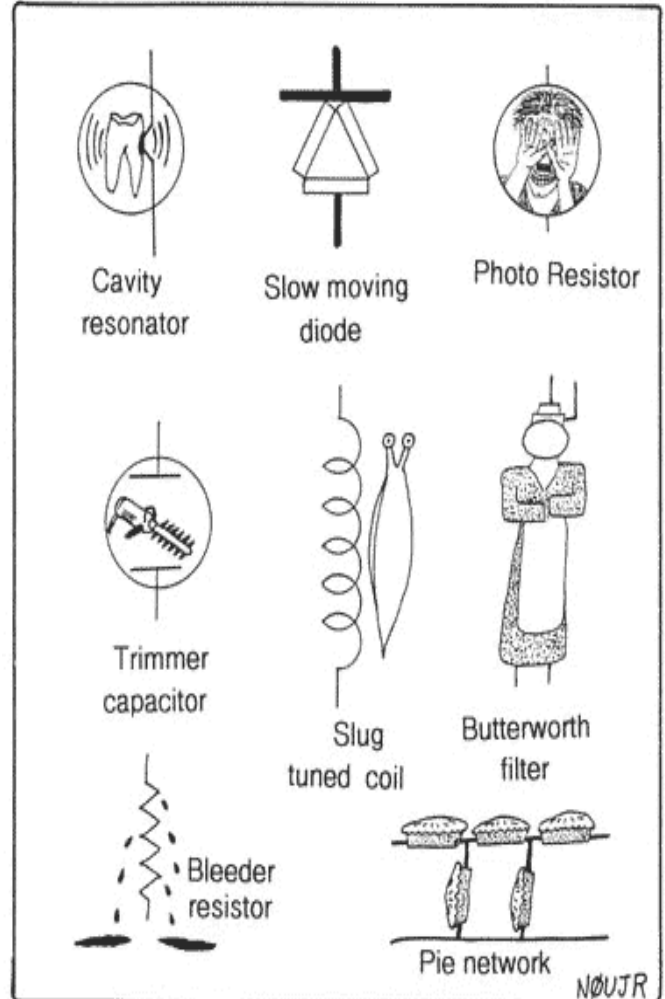

DIRECTIONS: From Highway 99 South of Fresno, exit Clovis Ave. Go north to Shaw and turn left on Shaw to Minnewawa. Turn right on Minnewawa and then left to the Mobile Home Park.. From Highway 41 or Highway 99 North of Fresno, take Shaw Ave. exit, turn right (East), to Minnewawa Ave and turn left. Then turn left into the Mobile Home Park.

So I guess its "Time" to say "Watch" out for time, as it will pass quickly no matter how many clocks we have. Use each minute as if it was your last, for some day it will be.

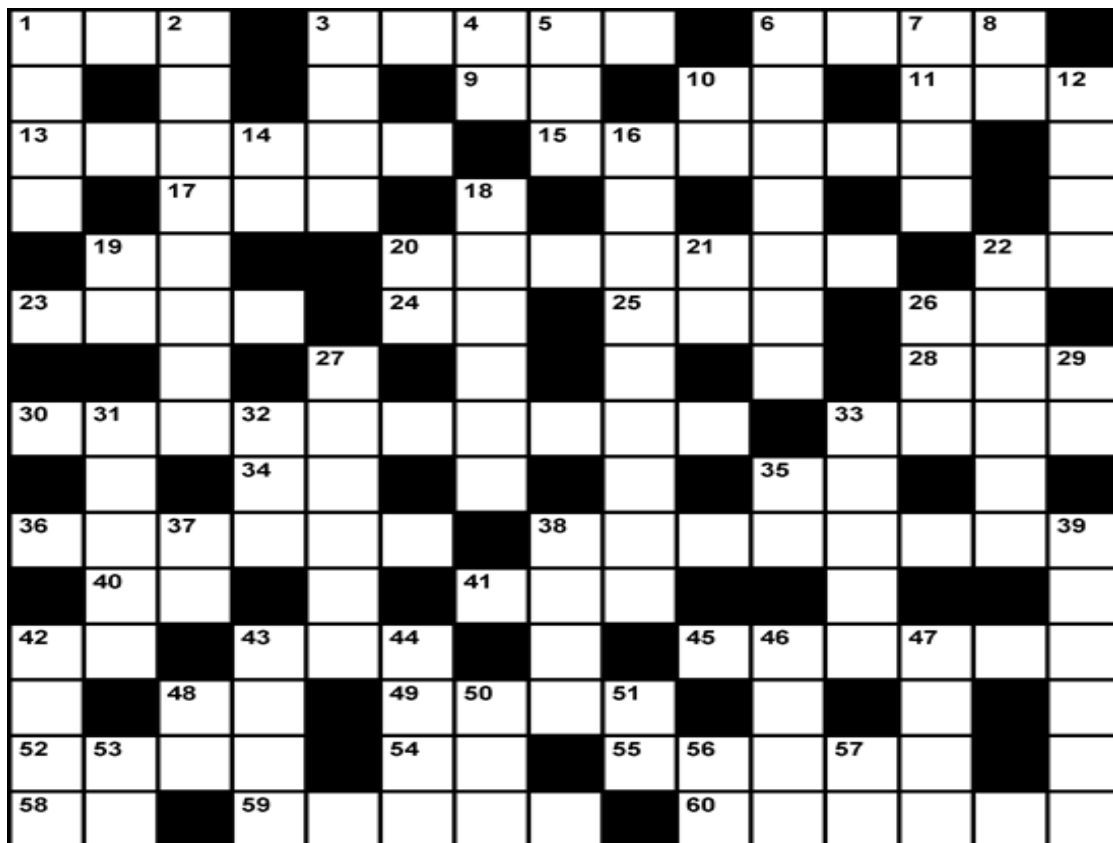
Take Time to Watch your children grow; take Time to Watch the flowers bloom. Take Time to put up that new antenna. And take Time to enjoy your friends and family.
