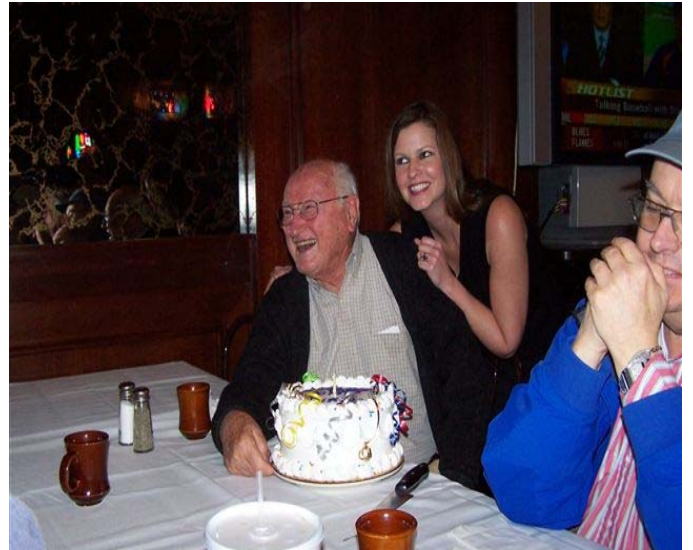
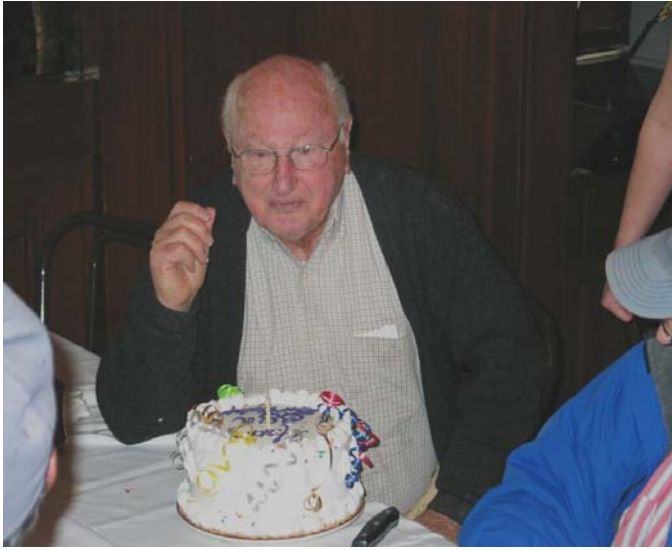

RADIO FUN – “Going to Dayton?”

What does one call 25,000+ amateur radio enthusiasts, 500 inside-arena selling spaces and a huge 2,500-space flea market in one location at one time? It officially is known as the annual Dayton Hamvention. I call it nirvana. Here is your annual opportunity to see and touch (and buy) the latest in amateur equipment and who knows what one will find in the flea market spaces except good prices? Maybe that rare accessory or “boat anchor,” components, cable, and everything in between? Just about any vendor in the radio hobby will be at the Hamvention in one form or other.

The Hamvention will be held this year May 19-21 at the Hara Arena (1001 Shiloh Springs Road, Trotwood, Ohio) just outside of Dayton proper. The Dayton Amateur Radio Association (DARA) annually since 1952 has sponsored this gathering of hams. It just keeps getting better and bigger every year. They earn their operating revenue from this event. The funds are used for scholarships, education, disasters and public service events, the 10 monthly editions of the award winning "RF Carrier" newsletter, upkeep of the various repeaters and membership activities.

Dayton Hamvention will once again be "speaking to the world" via **their Special Event Station, W8BI**. Attendees may operate the station using their license privileges during show hours, May 19- 21.

Frequencies to be used: 3.870/3.650; 7.270/7.050; 10.110; 14.270/14.050; 18.130/18.090; 21.370/21.050; 28.670/28.050; 147.55 Simplex.

DARA repeaters are 146.940 (PL 123.0) on 2 Meters which will be the primary talk-in repeater (146.910 is the back-up talk-in machine); 223.940 on 220; 442.100 on 440; and their ATV repeater is 426.250. If you are looking for other area repeaters, they will be listed in a repeater directory under Montgomery County, Ohio. One thing I can tell you from past experience is the amount of intermod over all of the amateur frequencies is phenomenal. The repeaters and the simplex frequencies will be going almost non-stop. If you go with a buddy, I recommend you either bring a couple of General Mobile Radio Service (license required) radios or a couple of cheap Family Radio Service (FRS) radios for comms between you and your partner.

GMRS frequencies: 462.550/467.550;
462.575/467.575; 462.600/467.600;
462.625/467.625; 462.675/467.675;

462.700/467.700; 462.750/467.750; 462.5625; 462.5875; 462.6125; 462.6375; 462.6625; 462.6875; 462.7125. I guarantee you will have a lot better time of staying in touch with your mates on GMRS as opposed to the amateur frequencies. Use the amateur frequencies if you want to jump into the noise and attempt to communicate with other hams. There are a couple of notes: the GMRS interstitial frequencies are limited to ½ watt ERP and the 462.675 are designated for travelers and emergencies. In 1999, there was a change to the GMRS license. Prior to that date, one could only be licensed for any two of the GMRS primary frequencies; after 2/16/99, the licensing was amended so that a GMRS licensee can legally operate on any GMRS frequency. There is also one other restriction on 462.650; 467.650 and 467.700 where one is previously restricted due to “line A” and “Line C” issues. The times I have been to the Hamvention, I have used my amateur HT and my GMRS 5 watt HT; GMRS does not suffer as much from all of the intermod issues on 2 meters and 440. For those of you that are curious, my GMRS licensed callsign is KAE9222.

If you do not have a GMRS license, consider using a couple of the license-free FRS blister-pack radios that one can pick up at Wal-Mart, Costco, Radio Shack or the like. The advantage is they are very inexpensive and in they share some of the GMRS frequencies. Most GMRS and FRS radios support tone squelch.

Directions to the Hara Arena which is located at 1001 Shiloh Springs Road, Trotwood, Ohio.

Getting there from the East

Interstate 70 Westbound (from Columbus, Ohio and points east)

Take exit 29 (state route 48/Main Street) south 3 miles to Shiloh Springs Road.

Turn right onto Shiloh Springs Road

Travel 1 mile west to Hara Arena.

From the West

Interstate 70 Eastbound (from Richmond, Indiana and points west)

Travel south on state route 49 (Salem Avenue) 4 miles to Shiloh Springs Road.

Consider parking at the Salem Mall that will be on your left and taking the Hamvention® bus to the Arena.

Turn left onto Shiloh Springs Road and travel east 1 mile to the Arena.

From the North and South

Interstate 75

Exit 58 (Needmore Road).

Travel west 3.5 miles on Needmore road (Wright Brothers Parkway).

As you travel, it will change names (Shoup Mill and then Turner Road).

Turn right onto Wolf Road and travel 0.3 miles north to Hara Arena.

For you **GPS** buffs, Hara is at: N39°49.307' W84°15.422'

If you are flying out of Fresno (FAT) into Dayton (DAY) you have a choice of airlines that have major hub locations which may serve Dayton. The last time I went was on American (AA) connecting out of D/FW (Dallas). The hubs served out of Fresno are D/FW (Dallas), LAS (Las Vegas), LAX (Los Angeles), PHX (Phoenix), SLC (Salt Lake City), SFO (San Francisco), SEA (Seattle), PDX (Portland, OR), and DEN (Denver). While researching this article, I found there are no non-stops to DAY out of FAT (aka FYI) or even a direct (a stop but no plane change). To get to Dayton from here will be at least a one or two stopper. One year I went, on the return leg all flights on AA were canceled out of DAY due to a major hailstorm that damaged planes coming out of D/FW. I was rerouted on a different airline out of Columbus so you may want to look at that city as an alternate.

If you can't make the Hamvention this year, there is always next year. Remember that it just keeps

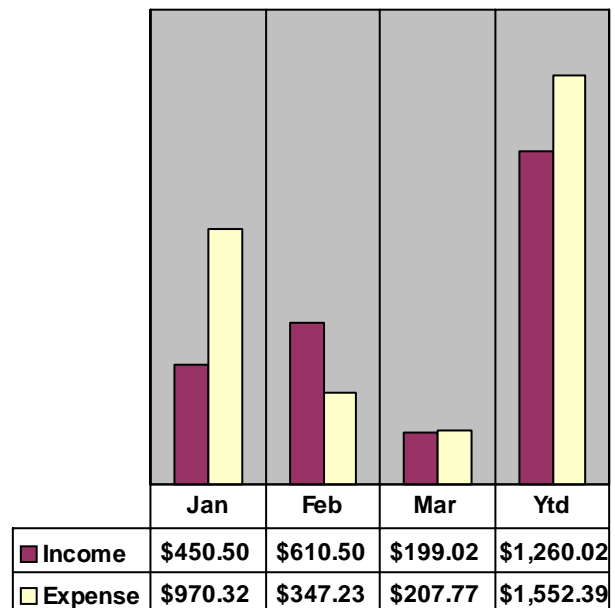
getting better! The dates for next year's Hamvention are May 18-20 2007. Every ham should make the trek to the Dayton Hamvention at least once in his lifetime.
