64th Fresno Hamfest August 5, 2006

You are cordially invited to attend the 64th Fresno Hamfest on August 5, 2006 from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM. The Hamfest will be held at the Satellite Student Union on the CSUF Campus. The Satellite Union is located on Maple Ave. You enter the campus on Barstow Ave from either Cedar Ave or Chestnut Ave. Turn South on Maple Ave, and you will see the Satellite Union. There is ample parking available.

The Fresno Hamfest began in 1936 and has been held each year since, except for the War years. This years event will include swap tables, commercial exhibits, tech talks, lunch with a keynote speaker, talk-in station with a radio raffle on 146.34/94 W6TO repeater, club and other ham radio organization displays, and prizes.

The main prize for this year's Hamfest is "Build Your Own Radio", a \$1,000 gift certificate from Amateur Electronic Supply. Tickets are \$10 each with only 300 tickets to be sold.





### THE DX CORNER By Charles McConnell W6DPD

NOTICE: The address of the Sixth District QSL Bureau is now P. O. Box 970, Fairfax CA 94978-0970. You can send address labels and \$0.70 for each envelope to the address above. They will put 1 unit of First Class postage on the envelope. The new price was effective Jan. 01, 2006.

If you work DX, you should have envelopes at the QSL bureau. The address is at the top. Your QSL cards received at the bureau may be put in the trash after they sit in the bureau for 90 days.

New IRCs will begin being issued on July 1. The current IRCs expire on Dec. 31, 2006. If you have any current IRCs, you should turn them in to the post office for an 84 cent stamp. But, there is a document from the International Postal Union, which states that IRCs never expire, so take you chances.

Six meters has provided some DX contacts from the west coast this summer. Canada, Alaska, Japan, and Mexico are a few that have been contacted. When 6 meters is open, low power stations with vertical antennas are successful.

Montenegro will be a potential new DXCC Entity since the population voted to split from Serbia. One of 2 things has to happen before Montenegro can be added to the DXCC list. 1. It must be admitted to the United Nations, or 2. It must receive a call sign block issued by the ITU. Once this occurs, then the DXCC Desk can add the new entity. Anyway, the DXCC count will be 336 soon. As soon as Montenegro receives the required things to become a DXCC entity, a multinational DXpedition will take place. It is already being planned.

ARRL has adopted 3rd criteria for becoming a DXCC entity. This should add some new ones to the DXCC list.

Even though we are near the solar minimum for this sunspot cycle, there is still DX out there. Get on the air.

Watch the DX Bulletins for up to date information. As the time for the operation is at hand, watch the DX Summit for listings. There are a number of state QSO parties each year. Check the contest corral in QST or the ARRL web page. State QSO parties are a good place to collect states for your Worked All States award. ARRL Log Book of the World now supports the Worked All States Award.

<u>LOCATION:</u> ....Bonaventure Mobile Home Park, 1724 Minnewawa Ave Clovis CA 93612-2545. Exams are held in the community room.

DIRECTIONS: <u>From Highway 99 South of Fresno</u>, exit Clovis Ave. Go north to Shaw and turn left on Shaw to Minnewawa. Turn right on Minnewawa and then left to the Mobile Home Park. <u>From Highway 41 or Highway 99 North of Fresno</u>, take Shaw Ave. exit, turn right (East), to Minnewawa Ave and turn left. Then turn left into the Mobile Home Park.

Theory exams are multiple choice. Code Exam is fill in the blank. Express mail is used to send paperwork to ARRL, who sends data to FCC via electronic mail, thus assuring the fastest possible service on new licenses which typically arrive in about two weeks.

BRING. Two ID's, one with photo. Taxpayer ID Number (Social Security Number), ULS registration Number or FCC Registration Number. Fee \$14.00 per test session. Bring Exact change. Original and copy of Amateur License and CSCE's if upgrading. Talk in on 146.94 repeater.
