THE DX CORNER

NOTICE: The address of the Sixth District QSL Bureau is now P. O. Box 970, Fairfax CA 94978-0970. You can send address labels and \$0.70 for each envelope to the address above. They will put 1 unit of First Class postage on the envelope. The new price was effective Jan. 01, 2006.

If you work DX, you should have envelopes at the QSL bureau. The address is at the top. Your QSL cards received at the bureau may be put in the trash after they sit in the bureau for 90 days.

New IRCs will begin being issued on July 1 and they expire on Dec. 31, 2009. The current IRCs expire on Dec. 31, 2006. If you have any current IRCs, you should turn them in to the post office for an 84 cent stamp. The U.S. Post Office now has said that it will not redeem IRCs issued before 2002. These have no bar code on them and are smaller than the current issue.

The CQ Worldwide DX Contests are the last weekend in October (SSB) and the last weekend in November (CW). This is a good time to increase your DXCC total. Many are DXpeditions with QSL Managers in the U.S.

CQ Magazine sponsors the Field Award. This uses the fields of the Maidenhead Grid Square System for the award. QSL cards are needed to confirm contacts with the fields. There are 324 fields around the earth with many completely over water. Check with CQ magazine for the rules. The grid square system came out of Europe when the vhf contesters wanted to do something to increase multipliers. The result of the conference at Maidenhead England was the Maidenhead Grid Square System where the earth was divided in to 324 Fields and each field divided into 100 grid squares. There are 32,400 grid squares around the earth. ARRL adopted the grid square system when the VUCC Award was created, and it was then used for the VHF contests.

Even though we are near the solar minimum for this sunspot cycle, there is still DX out there. Get on the air.

LOCATION:Bonaventure Mobile Home Park, 1724 Minnewawa Ave Clovis CA 93612-2545. Exams are held in the community room.


DIRECTIONS: From Highway 99 South of Fresno, exit Clovis Ave. Go north to Shaw and turn left on Shaw to Minnewawa. Turn right on Minnewawa and then left to the Mobile Home Park.. From Highway 41 or Highway 99 North of Fresno, take Shaw Ave. exit, turn right (East), to Minnewawa Ave and turn left. Then turn left into the Mobile Home Park.

Theory exams are multiple choice. Code Exam is fill in the blank. Express mail is used to send paperwork to ARRL, who sends data to FCC via electronic mail, thus assuring the fastest possible service on new licenses which typically arrive in about two weeks.

BRING. Two ID's, one with photo. Taxpayer ID Number (Social Security Number), ULS registration Number or FCC Registration Number. Fee \$14.00 per test session. Bring Exact change. Original and copy of Amateur License and CSCE's if upgrading. Talk in on 146.94 repeater.


