By-Laws Revisions

The By-laws for FARC have not been changed for many years. Due to the fact that we are now a 501 (c)(3) non-profit, it is time to make changes. The Board of Directors approved the following changes to the Fresno ARC By-Laws on August 7, 2007. The vote on the changes will be done at the September meeting. The portions to be deleted are in strike through and the proposed additions or changes are underlined.

Article I General

SECTION 1. PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The principal office for the transaction of business of the corporation is hereby fixed and located at 3079 E. Madison Ave. 7454 W. Fairmont Ave., Fresno, California 93701 93722,

SECTION 3. NON-PROFIT RESOLUTION

a. The organization is established exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and/or scientific purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

b. No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be the carrying on of propoganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of state-

ments) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities that are not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

c. Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose.

Article II Meetings of Members

SECTION 2. ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of the members of this Corporation shall be held on the second Friday of October of each year, at eight (8) o'clock P.M. at the regular meeting start time

SECTION 8. ELECTION OF DIRECTORS Added to the section.

. Should the number of candidates for director be equal to or less than the number of vacancies for director; the Secretary shall cast a unanimous ballot for the slate of candidates for director.

SECTION 9. Conduct of Meetings

Meetings shall be conducted according to Robert's Rules of Order: Newly Revised.

Article III Directors (Add Section 6 and renumber sections 7 to 11)

SECTION 6. Conduct of Meetings

Meetings shall be conducted according to Robert's Rules of Order: Newly Revised.

SECTION 11. POWERS OF DIRECTORS added to the section

At the beginning of each fiscal year, the Board of Directors shall review and establish its Standing Orders of the Board, including the maximum amount of money to be expended per purchase without prior general membership approval. The treasurer shall report this amount of money to the general membership

Article IV Officers

SECTION 3. REMOVAL AND RESIGNATION

The Board of Directors shall appoint and remove all officers, members of the Board, agents, and /or employees of the Corporation,

SECTION 4. COMPENSATION OF OFFICERS

No officer, board member, agent or employee of the Corporation

Article V Duties of Officers

SECTION 2 VICE PRESIDENT

The Vice President shall be vested with all powers and shall perform all the duties of the President in case of the absence, resignation, removal or disability of the President

ARTICLE VI MEMBERS (Add Section 2, renumber remaining sections)

SECTION 2. KINDS OF MEMBERS

FULL MEMBERS. Full members shall possess a valid Amateur Radio License issued by the government and are entitled to all rights and privileges including the right to vote in all club elections and hold office.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS. Associate members do not possess a valid Amateur Radio License. They are entitled to all rights and privileges of Full Members EXCEPT the right to vote in club elections and to hold office.

FAMILY MEMBERS. Anyone residing at the residence of a Full or Associate Member may join the

club as a family member. They shall have all rights and privileges as a Full or as an Associate member except they will not receive the regular periodical publication.

SECTION 5. DUES

Each applicant for Full, Associate or Family membership in this Corporation shall pay dues in such sum and amount per year as shall be fixed by resolution of the Board

SECTION 6. PUBLICATIONS

Each dues-paying full or associate member shall be entitled to receive, at no additional charge,

SECTION 7. REMOVAL OF OFFICERS/DIRECTORS

The general membership may remove any or all Director(s) and elect new Director(s) to complete the unexpired term(s) by an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) majority of the general membership present at general or special meeting duly called for that purpose. Voting at such a meeting must be in person.

NOTICE: The address of the Sixth District QSL Bureau is now P. O. Box 970, Fairfax CA 94978-0970. You can send address labels and \$0.70 for each envelope to the address above. They will put 1 unit of First Class postage on the envelope. The new price was effective Jan. 01, 2006. With the increase in U.S. Postage rates, you may need to send some money to the QSL Bureau.

If you work DX, you should have envelopes at the QSL bureau. The address is at the top. Your QSL cards received at the bureau may be put in the trash after they sit in the bureau for 90 days. If you change your call sign, then you need to maintain envelopes for both call signs at the bureau, if you have been working DX with both call signs.

If you want help with DX, you can contact the local members of the Central California DX Club for some assistance. Charles W6DPD 431-2038, Perry K6XJ 299-2802, or Jim WS6X 292-8353 can give you advice. The big thing about finding DX is to tune the bands.

A number of the local DX'ers meet for breakfast on the First Saturday of the month at the Red Caboose Café, 50 W. Bullard in Clovis. The group gathers between 0700 and 0800 AM. Anyone interested in DX or learning about it is invited to attend. If you are going to work DX, you need to be on the bands early in the morning.

The Central California DX Club was formed in 1981. It is an ARRL affiliated club with 53 members in the central part of California. The club meets at Apple Annie's at 11:30 AM on Saturdays in Tulare 4 to 5 times a year, and they have a breakfast meeting at the International DX Convention in Visalia. 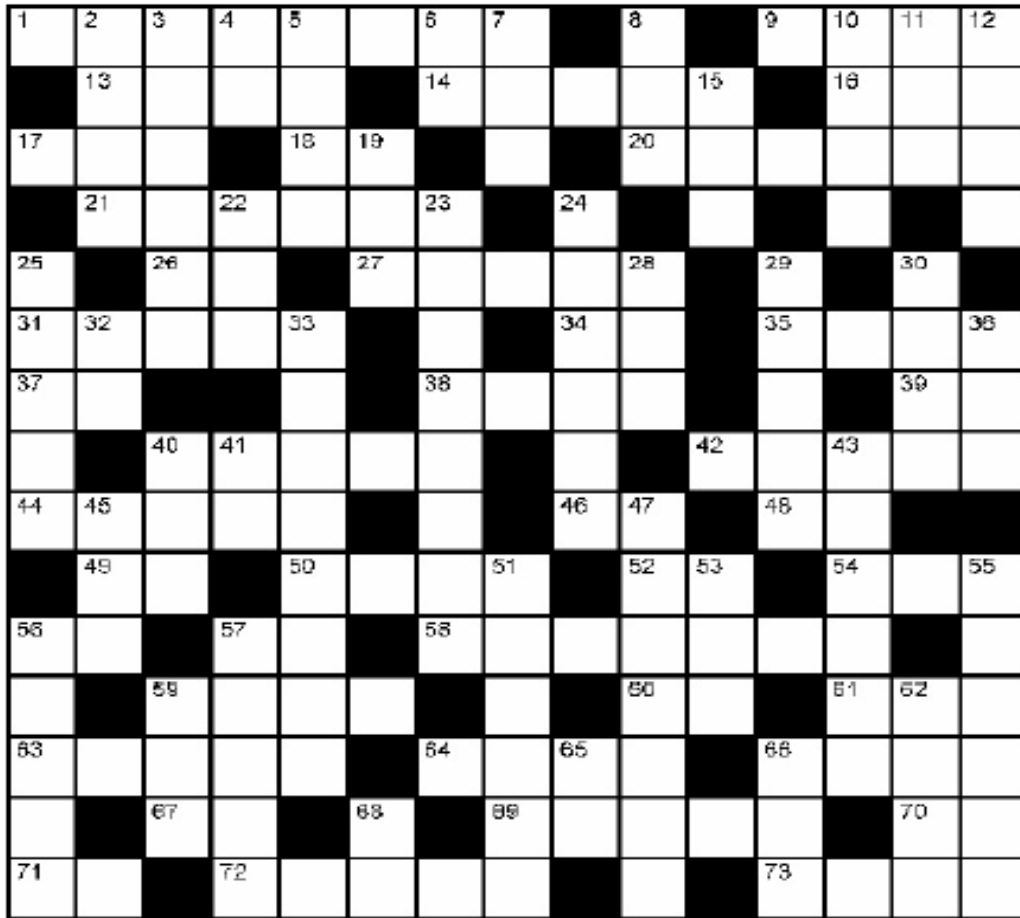
